

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA Class XI

FAQs:

1) What is the criteria for admission in class 11 CBSE?

A student who has completed 14 years of age on 31st March of the year and has passed Class X from CBSE or an equivalent Board may be granted admission in Class XI after allowing 1 year age relaxation in the minimum age criteria.

2) How much percentage is required to take Science in 11th(PCB)?

To get seat in 11th standard or intermediate in science stream with subjects like Physics, Biology and Chemistry, minimum **70 percentage to 80 percentage** in 10th standard from a recognized Board.

3) What is the criteria for admission in class 11 PCM Stream?

For taking up PCM in class 11th, you need to score a minimum of 85% in class 10th board examination. However, you may note that stream selection is done before board examination results are declared, hence a decent score between **80-85%** is required during your preboards/prelims.

4) What is the criteria for admission in class 11 COMMERCE/HUMANITIES Stream?

For taking up 11 COMMERCE/HUMANITIES in class 11th, you need to score a minimum of 55% in class 10th board examination. However, you may note that stream selection is done before board examination results are declared, hence a decent score between **50-55%** is required during your preboards/prelims.

Eligibility Requirements for classes below class X

- To be eligible, the students must pass their qualifying class from any state board or any board recognised or approved by the Government.
- No admission will be accepted if the student has qualified for their class from any board that the State or Central government does not approve.
- The age of the applicant students should be compatible with the class they are applying for.
- The qualifying examination should be cleared with the minimum required marks.
- Any student with the status of debarred, rusticated or expelled from the examination course shall not be allowed for admission.
- Without fulfilling the regular course, no student shall be admitted or promoted into the next class of the schools affiliated with the board.
